
## A Greentours trip to Colombia - January 2024

Montezuma Lodge was fantastic with many butterflies coming to the foul smelling bait and birds coming to the feeders even in the rain. There were many often colourful hummingbirds and we found a few of the endemic birds (I only count them if I got a photograph!). Cock of the Rock was readily seen at Jardin and the hotel there was pretty special too (we were the first guests to stay there) with good gardens for insects and birds.

Santa Marta was a wonderful place with some stunning views although the hotel organisation left a lot to be desired.








